- Marilyn also calculated and recorded the club stats for attendance at club events.





- Over those 3 days, Elizabeth and PeterG facilitated programs for a total of 119 students, invoicing \$450. This allowed Dorothy to facilitate programs for an additional 350 students on those same days, invoicing \$370.

This award recognizes and celebrates individuals/groups/organizations for sustained commitment to quality practice or program delivery that promotes and/or facilitates outdoor play. Qualified nominees have demonstrated dedication, commitment, passion, innovation or creativity to current practice or program delivery to promote/facilitate quality outdoor play experiences.



The Outdoor Play Canada Practice Award recognizes and celebrates individuals/groups/organizations for sustained commitment to quality practice or program delivery that promotes and/or facilitates outdoor play. Qualified nominees have demonstrated dedication, commitment, passion, innovation or creativity to current practice or program delivery to promote/facilitate quality outdoor play experiences.



2023 winner: Dorothy Penner

Dorothy Penner is a leader and mentor in the field of outdoor play. She runs the Kids Run Wild Youth and School programs with Edmonton Overlanders Orienteering Club, which teach people how to use maps to explore nature. Orienteering is a form of outdoor play that involves navigating through natural environments using maps, which is all about route choice, decision making and navigation. Orienteering involves walking, running, climbing, and jumping over different terrains and obstacles. Dorothy facilitates programming for over 7000 students annually through the orienteering school program, with students ranging from kindergatent to university. Until June 2023, she was our club's only employee and directly interacted with each student. Dorothy has inspired and supported many youth to enjoy and appreciate the outdoors through orienteering. She also trains orienteering instructors who continue to spread the joy of outdoor play to others.

3f) Mapping Coordinator (Geraint Edmunds):

• This year considerable effort has been put in to review the maps of areas being considered for the Canadian Championships in 2025. Up near Smoky Lake several people helped check the suitability of the White Earth map. There is a lot of new deadfall. Don Bayly re-mapped about 1 sq km in an area with less deadfall and we are in the process of obtaining new LiDAR data to help evaluate the rest of the area. At the Blackfoot Central Staging Area, I made a large base map (approx. 20 sq km) from LiDAR data, that was sufficient to hold a 6 hour Score O. Don Bayly is currently doing detailed mapping of one of the fields there to help evaluate that area. Costs for the above mapping totals about \$9.000 so far, with another \$3,000 for the work currently being done.

Other mapping includes the following:

- Stefan made a revised Riverlot 56 map in St Albert, which was used for a Wednesday event. Stefan also started work on a map of the MacTaggart Sanctuary and made some up-dates to the Belgravia map.
- Dorothy made three new small maps: Evergreen Park, Charlesworth Park and Blackmud Creek for the EPL 2 Go program, as well as Four Seasons Park in Beaumont and Ken Hodgins Park in Fort Saskatchewan. Elizabeth is working on a map at St Basil school.
- I revised the Strathcona Wilderness Centre map with new LiDAR data. It was used for the Course Planning and Ski O in March, as well as for other SWC orienteering programs. I also made the new Glengarry Park map and expanded the Griesbach map.

3g) Field Training (Angela Pearson):

- "Low-Energy, High-Quality Training" is planned at Dalmuir on Sunday, October 15.
- There will be about 8 courses to choose from, ranging from < 3 km to around 5 km. There will be no-trails maps as well as ones with all the trails shown. There will be "O With A Pro" available for people with less confidence in the forest.
